We are committed towards positive impact and strive for sustainability across every function, including sourcing and procurement.

• Business Ethics:

- i. complying with all relevant local and international laws regarding ethical business practices and best practice governance
- ii. demonstrate active policies or procedures to prevent fraud, corruption, conflicts of interest and data security breaches

• Human Rights:

- complying with all relevant local and international laws in accordance with the principles of the International Labor Organization, the UN Global Compact and the UN Universal Declaration of Human Rights
- ii. prohibit the use of forced, bonded or child labour across the entire supply chain
- iii. prohibit any unlawful discrimination and harassment and providing a safe and inclusive work environment

- i. providing employees with an acceptable living wage (at least at or above the minimum wage level set by local government)
- ii. partner with local communities and government to contribute to the improvement of education, environmental awareness and the cultural, economic and social well-being of communities in which they operate in
